THE SOCIAL ASSISTANCE ACT OF 2015

By the authority of the faith of the assembly of American Nationals, in Union under the Law of Nations, and all Acts, petitioned, accepted and acknowledged by the current United States, in Congress assembled, are hereby ordained for the safety and security of our posterity, enact the following on the 20th day of March, 2015.





BE IT ENACTED, by the United States, in Congress assembled THE SOCIAL ASSISTANCE ACT OF 2015 IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED, ACCEPTED AND ACKNOWLEDGED on the 20th day of March 2015.

The Social Assistance Act of 2015

An act to provide for the general welfare by establishing a system of National old-age privileges, blind persons, disabled, dependent and crippled children, maternal and child welfare, public health; to establish a Social Assistance Board; and for other purposes.

By the authority of the faith of the assembly of American Nationals, in Union under the Law of Nations, and all Acts, petitioned, accepted and acknowledged by the current United States, in Congress assembled, are hereby ordained for the safety and security of our posterity, enact the following on the 20th day of March 2015.

BE IT ENACTED, by the United States, in Congress assembled **THE SOCIAL ASSISTANCE ACT OF 2015** IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED, ACCEPTED AND ACKNOWLEDGED on the **20th day of March 2015**.

TITLE I OLD AGE PRIVILEGE EXCLUSIVE

§1.1 NATIONAL OLD-AGE SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PLAN

- **A.** A National plan for old-age assistance must:
 - (1) provide that it shall be in effect for all Nationals and RESIDENTS for The United States of America, and, if administered by the Social Assistance Board, (*Board*) or the General Post Office, be mandatory upon them;
 - (2) either provide for the establishment or designation of a single National body to administer the plan, and to supervise the administration of the plan;
 - (3) provide for enforcement to any human being, whose claim for old-age assistance is denied, an opportunity for a fair hearing before such Human Rights Tribunal;
 - (4) provide that the General Post Office will make such reports, in such form and containing such information, as the Board may from time to time require, and comply with such provisions as the Board may from time to time find necessary to assure the correctness and verification of such reports; and
 - (5) An age requirement of sixty-five years, except that the plan may impose, or
 - (6) An oath or affirmation claiming the American Nationality (National) or a declared RESIDENT status for at least five years within The United States of America.

§1.2 **VOUCHER PROGRAM**

- **A.** One day after reaching the age of 65 years, the National or declared RESIDENT shall qualify for the Voucher Program.
- **B.** The method of computing and redeeming such amounts shall be as follows:
 - (1) The Board shall approve each voucher signed by the affirmed National or declared RESIDENT for services rendered out of necessity through regulations agreed upon by the Board.
 - (2) The services rendered shall be exclusive to the qualified affirmed National or declared RESIDENT and shall not be loaned, borrowed, or rendered by or to anyone that is not a qualified affirmed National or declared RESIDENT that has not reached the age of 65 years and one day.

(3) The office of the Treasury shall thereupon, through the account thereby requesting assistance shall disperse the funds so requested upon reasonable costs for services rendered or needs met

§1.3 OPERATION OF GOVERNMENT PLANS ADMINISTRATION

A. The administration shall be designated to the Board to administer such regulations and rules as prescribed by the office of the Treasury for The United States of America based on reports received from the General Post Office. The settlement board for all conflicts shall be the Human Rights Tribunal.

§1.4 **DEFINITIONS**

A. When used in this title the term **old age assistance** means: *Service vouchers signed by aged sixty-five or older affirmed American Nationals and declared RESIDENTS.*

TITLE II HANDICAP VOUCHER PROGRAM

§2.1 PAYMENTS UPON DEATH

A. If any individual dies before attaining the age of sixty-five, there shall be paid to his or her estate an amount equal to what was saved if so posited into the office of the Treasury for The United States of America.

§2.2 <u>VOUCHER PROGRAM TO AGED INDIVIDUALS NOT QUALIFIED FOR ASSISTANCE</u>

A. Qualification shall be mandatory.

§2.3 METHOD OF LIQUIDATING VOUCHERS

A. The Board shall from time to time certify to the Secretary of the Treasury the name and address of each person entitled to sign vouchers under this title, the amount of such liquidation, and the time at which it should be liquidated, and the Secretary of the Treasury through the General Post Office, and shall make such posit in accordance with the certification by the Board.

§2.4 <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>

A. The right of anyone to sign a voucher under this title shall not be transferable or assignable, at law or in equity, and none of the moneys posited or payable or rights existing under this title

shall not be subject to execution, levy, attachment, garnishment, or other legal process, or to the operation of any bankruptcy or insolvency law. This section does not prohibit power of attorney.

§2.5 PENALTIES

A. Whoever in any notice for any qualification under this title makes any false statement as to any material fact, knowing such statement to be false, shall be fined not more than +1,000 or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.

§2.6 DEFINITIONS

TITLE III UNEMPLOYMENT VOUCHER PROGRAM

§3.1 SIX MONTH VOUCHER PROGRAM

A. Any affirmed American National or declared RESIDENT who cannot find an adequate means of self support shall qualify for the voucher program for six months and no longer.

TITLE IV VOUCHERS TO DEPENDENT CHILDREN

§4.1 **VOUCHER PROGRAM FOR A DETERMINED PERIOD OF TIME**

A. In the event that a child under the age of 18 becomes a dependent of someone other than the natural mother and father shall qualify for the voucher program upon the signature of the the caretaker, next of kin if available. The vouchers shall be used to pay the expense of raising the child to the age of eighteen and shall not be used for any other purpose.

§4.2 DEFINITIONS

A. When used in this title:

(1) The term **dependent child** means: a child under the age of eighteen who has been deprived of parental support or care by reason of the death, continued absence from the home, or physical or mental incapacity of a parent, and who is living with his father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, brother, sister, stepfather, stepmother, stepbrother, stepsister, uncle, or aunt, in a place of residence maintained by one or more of such relatives as his or their own home;

§4.3 CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

A. The child, after the age of eighteen shall qualify for the voucher program as long as the young adult learns a trade or studies for a career.

§4.4 TRUST FUND

§4.5 <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

A. **Trust Fund** means: a trust agreement that is created to keep track of the voucher program for each individual that qualifies for the voucher program.

§4.6 RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. When used in this title the term **voucher program to the blind** means: *voucher privileges to blind individuals*.

TITLE VI GENERAL PROVISIONS

§6.1 <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

- A. When used in this Act the term:
 - (1) **Natural person** means: a human being.
 - (2) **Entity** means: a trust or estate, a partnership, or a corporation. Corporation includes associations, joint-stock companies, and insurance companies.
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- (3) The terms **includes** and **including** when used in a definition contained in this Act shall not be deemed to exclude other things otherwise within the meaning of the term defined
- (4) Nothing in this Act shall be construed as authorizing anyone, or an agent, or representative, while carrying out any of the provisions of this Act, to take charge of any child over the objection of either of the parents of such child, or of the person standing in as caretaker to such child.

§6.2 RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. The Secretary of the Treasury, and the Social Assistance Board respectively, shall make and publish such rules and regulations not inconsistent with this Act, as may be necessary to the efficient administration of the functions with which each is charged under this Act.

§6.3 **SEVERABILITY**

A. If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Act, and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby eneral

§6.4 RESERVATION OF POWER

A. The right to alter, amend, or repeal any provision of this Act is hereby reserved to the assembly for the Government of The United States of America.

§6.5 **SHORT TITLE**

- **A.** This Act may be cited as the **Social Assistance Act**, approved March 18th, 2015.
- **B.** Grounds for judicial dissolution of claims:
 - (1) Claimants or those in control or receipt of the Social Assistance administration that have acted, are acting, or will act in a manner that is illegal, oppressive, or fraudulent in violation of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;

C. Judicial Dissolution Remedy:

(1) Anyone that is in violation of any one of the thirty articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights will have the opportunity within a **thirty** (30) day time limit to literally cure the violation(s), otherwise the proclamation of dissolution is in full force and effect after the thirty days if the violations have not been corrected, and
